Call for Science Fair Judges

Volunteer judges are needed for student projects at the upcoming regional science fair. All that is required is your expertise combined with a donation of your time.

The **Frontenac Lennox and Addington Science Fair** (FLASF) is celebrating its 41st Anniversary this year. We offer the opportunity for the students in all schools across the counties of Frontenac and Lennox & Addington to present their science projects to the public. One of approximately 100 such regional fairs across Canada, FLASF brings together about 150 students presenting some 100 science projects across the disciplines of Human Health Science, Life & Earth Science, Physical & Mathematical Science, and Engineering & Computing Science. Students from Grades 5 to 12 may attend the fair, with the majority in grades 6 to 8.

Returning and new judges are welcome so if you are interested in judging in this year's fair, please go to the science fair web site (www.flasf.on.ca) to complete your registration. We are seeking a diverse judging pool including professors, teachers, student-teachers, professional scientists and engineers, health care professionals, technicians, graduate students, postdoctoral fellows and research associates. Some projects need to be judged in French and require fluently bilingual judges. Judging categories are: Human Health Science; Life & Earth Science; Physical & Mathematical Science; and Engineering & Computing Science.

The on-site commitment is one evening of judging: Thursday evening, starting with welcome and training at 5:30 pm, followed by the judging from 6:00-9:00 pm. There will also be a 2 hour slot, 9:00 to 11:00 am on Friday morning, for those judges who are available to review the Best-of-Fair projects and remaining Special Awards. A light supper (sandwiches and coffee) will be provided on Thursday night. Judging guidelines, a sample judging form, and project assignments and descriptions will be provided in advance.
